Rules and Regulations Regarding
Alcoholic Beverages in Aberdeen Parks
and Recreation Facilities

Effective June 8, 2022

ARTICLE 1
AUTHORITY

A. PURPOSE

This Alcohol Policy (“Policy”) establishes rules and regulations regarding the consumption, sales, and service of alcoholic beverages in the City of Aberdeen municipal parks and recreation facilities. It is the intention of the Park and Recreation Board (“Board”) to provide Aberdeen residents and visitors the broadest range of opportunities to safely enjoy the public parks and recreation facilities of the City.

B. AUTHORITY

Sec. 36-24 of the Aberdeen City Code delegates to the Board the duty and power to supervise and control all public parks and recreation facilities and related buildings located within and without the boundaries of the City of Aberdeen and owned or operated by the City for park, cultural, and recreational purposes.

Sec. 36-60 expressly grants the Board the authority to establish rules and regulations regarding the consumption and sales of alcoholic beverages in the public parks and recreation facilities in a manner consistent with the City Code and South Dakota laws.

The Aberdeen Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department (“PRF”) serves the Board by planning, managing, and coordinating the activities and functions of the public parks and recreation facilities, operating the recreational and cultural programs of the city, and maintaining the public parks, recreation facilities, and city cemeteries. The PRF is required to carry out this Policy through its Director or other designated official (“PRF official”).

C. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Policy shall be effective beginning June 8, 2022, and may be amended from time to time.

D. DEFINITIONS

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this Policy, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Alcoholic Beverages: The phrase “*alcoholic beverages*” shall conform, at a minimum, to the definition and restrictions imposed by South Dakota law at SDCL Title 35, as amended. Types of alcoholic beverages include distilled spirits (“liquor”), wine, cider, and malt beverages (“beer”), and includes a beverage in which alcohol has been mixed or blended.

Consumption: The word “*consumption*” means consuming, serving, or possessing an alcoholic beverage within a sealed or unsealed container.

Facility Permit: The phrase “*Facility Permit*” means a revocable and nontransferable permit issued by a PRF official allowing for the exclusive use of a specific park property or recreational facility. Facility Permit types include, but are not limited to, public event permits, special occasion permits, race/walk permits, athletic permits, tournament permits, assembly/demonstration permits, and facility rental permits.

Group Activity / Public Event: The phrases “*group activity*” and “*public event*” for purposes of this Policy refer to a planned activity or event which intends to (a) serve or sell alcoholic beverages; and (b) requires the reservation of a designated park area or recreation facility.

License: The word “*license*” means an alcohol license issued by the State of South Dakota and the City of Aberdeen authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages in conformance with State laws, rules, and regulations, and City of Aberdeen ordinances, rules, and regulations. A Special Event License is a license.

Sale: The word “*sale*” means the transfer, for a consideration, of title to any alcoholic beverage. The transfer can be by exchange or barter, conditional or otherwise, alone or as part of a package or bundle with other goods, benefits, or services, in any manner and by any means whatsoever.

ARTICLE 2 **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES PROHIBITED**

As set forth in Sec. 36-62, the consumption and sale of any alcoholic beverage is *absolutely prohibited* at the following places in the public parks and recreation facilities:

- (1) Children’s playground areas;
- (2) Skateboard parks;
- (3) Aberdeen Aquatics Center;
- (4) Tennis, pickleball, volleyball, and basketball courts;
- (5) Parking lots and roadways;
- (6) Restrooms;
- (7) The beach, fishing piers, and waters of Lake Minne-Eho (Wylie Lake), but not including the shores;

- (8) Nicollet Park;
- (9) Aberdeen Recreation and Cultural Center, but not including the art gallery, library, arena, and theater;
- (10) Outdoor ice skating rinks;
- (11) Recreational trails and park pathways;
- (12) Cemeteries and memorial parks; and
- (13) During organized youth activities.

ARTICLE 3 **REQUIREMENTS AND RESTRICTIONS**

A. SITE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS AND RESTRICTIONS AT APPENDICES

Site specific requirements regarding alcoholic beverages at a particular park or recreation facility, or part thereof, are described in the tables at Appendix 1 (by alphabetical order) and Appendix 2 (by categories). This Policy establishes the general requirements and restrictions for the consumption and sale of alcoholic beverages with Appendix 1 and Appendix 2 particularly describing if, where, when, and what type of alcoholic beverages may be consumed or sold at the public parks and recreation facilities.

B. CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND AREAS

Alcohol is prohibited at all children's playground areas. Children's playgrounds are demarcated by borders and usually have softer play surfaces, like loose-fill rubber, sand, or wood fiber. Included as part of any playground area is the secured, peripheral bench-type seating intended for persons to supervise playing children.

C. ORGANIZED YOUTH ACTIVITY

Minor participants: Alcoholic beverages are prohibited within the areas of a park or recreation facility utilized by participants and spectators during an organized youth activity. An *organized youth activity* is a scheduled event in a reserved space primarily for participants under 18 years old. Such activities include, but are not limited to, baseball, basketball, football, hockey, ice skating, skateboarding, soccer, softball, tennis, dance, theater, and other youth-oriented recreational, educational, and cultural programming.

Spectators: The areas utilized include not only the space the participants are using (e.g., tee-ball field, basketball court, etc.) but also those peripheral spaces in close proximity and reasonably intended for use by *spectators* of the youth activity. For

example, alcoholic beverages would not be allowed in the bleacher seating or baseline areas of a tee-ball game.

Youth activity priority: The PRF is authorized to discourage the consumption of alcoholic beverages *in the general vicinity* of an organized youth activity, and may refuse to issue, or modify or revoke, a Facility Permit for that reason. Every effort will be made by the PRF to avoid a group activity or public event at the same time and in the general vicinity of an organized youth activity. But if such a conflict occurs (e.g., team qualified for state tournament game), the organized youth activity will have priority over the group activity or public event.

D. PERSONS BRINGING THEIR OWN ALCOHOL TO A PARK OR RECREATION FACILITY FOR THEIR OWN PERSONAL CONSUMPTION

Parks: Persons *visiting a park*, as opposed to attending a group activity or public event, might be allowed to bring with them for their own personal consumption their own beer, wine, and cider, but not liquor. The tables at Appendix 1 and Appendix 2 set forth if, where, when, and what types of alcoholic beverages individuals may bring with them to a specific park area without any special permission from a PRF official.

Recreation facility or park building (excluding picnic shelters): Persons *visiting a recreation facility or a park building* (e.g., Lee Park Golf Course, Birdhouse, Pavilion, etc.) may not bring with them for personal consumption any alcoholic beverage without a Facility Permit. Only alcoholic beverages sold or served at the recreation facility or park building may be consumed. The tables at Appendix 1 and Appendix 2 set forth if, where, when, and what types of alcoholic beverages individuals may consume at a specific recreation facility or park building with special permission from a PRF official.

E. CONCESSIONS WITH ALCOHOL LICENSES

Licensed concessions: Some concession operators at recreation facilities hold retail alcohol licenses for the premises described in their licenses. Presently, concession operators are licensed to sell beer at the following recreation facilities:

- Fossum Field Baseball Complex
- Lee Park Golf Course
- Moccasin Creek Softball / Baseball Complex
- Players Field North Softball Complex
- Players Field South Softball Complex

No other alcohol: By state law, only beer purchased from the concession operator is allowed on the licensed premises. Therefore, no alcohol can be *brought in from outside* the licensed premises. Likewise, no other type of alcohol can be *sold* on the licensed premises, even for a special event.

Nothing in this Policy shall be construed to prohibit a person's possession of alcoholic beverages which are purchased from, and while on the licensed premises, of a special retailers licensee or an on-sale licensee, including a licensed concession operator.

F. FACILITY PERMIT FROM PRF FOR ALCOHOL AT GROUP ACTIVITY OR PUBLIC EVENT

Facility Permit required: A group activity or public event involving alcoholic beverages must obtain a Facility Permit or other written approval from the Board or PRF official. Group activities and public events include, but are not limited to, reunions, weddings, receptions, parties, dances, fundraisers, and entertainment and athletic events.

Conditions: Persons receiving a Facility Permit must abide by all conditions listed in the permit. The conditions are intended to protect persons participating in the group activity or public event, other users of the park or recreation facility, and public property, and to preserve the peace and quiet of neighborhoods. Conditions may be tailored by the Board or PRF official to address specific needs or concerns of a particular activity or event.

Insurance: Risk of injuries to people and damages to property increases when alcohol is present at a public event. The Facility Permit for a public event which will include alcoholic beverages must require the permittee to submit to the PRF, at least 48 hours before the activity or event, a certificate of liability insurance in a coverage amount not less than \$1,000,000. The required coverage may be increased by the Board or Director depending on the risks inherent in the public event or for a commercial event. The certificate of insurance shall list or name the City of Aberdeen as an additional insured. The failure to timely submit the required certificate of insurance may result in revocation of the Facility Permit and cancellation of the public event.

G. SPECIAL EVENT LICENSE FROM CITY COUNCIL TO SELL ALCOHOL

Consult Appendices: A person or group who wants to *sell* alcoholic beverages at a park or recreation facility must first determine at Appendix 1 or Appendix 2 if, where, when, and what type of alcoholic beverages may be sold at the park or facility for the event. If alcohol sales may be allowed, a Special Event License to sell alcoholic beverages must be applied for at the City Finance Office and approved by the City Council.

Special Event License: Special Event Licenses may only be issued to civic, charitable, educational, fraternal, and veterans organizations, and to certain business licensees. The Finance Office takes all applications for Special Event Licenses. Some applications may require a public hearing by the Council before the Special Event License can be granted.

Coordination: The Board, the PRF, the City Council, and the applicant will work together to establish any conditions or restrictions for the issuance of a Special Event License. Every activity requiring a Special Event License will also require a Facility Permit from the Board or PRF official.

Compliance: Every Special Event Licensee must comply with all local, state, and federal laws, rules, and regulations applicable to the sale and/or service of alcoholic beverages. All alcoholic beverages must be served, sold, and consumed only at the location and on the premises specified in the Special Event License and as may be further restricted by the Facility Permit. Any person who carries an alcoholic beverage off the permitted location may be in violation of the law, and any Special Event Licensee who fails to take reasonable measures to prevent alcohol from being carried off the premises will be in violation of state law.

H. OFF-SEASON SPECIAL EVENT FOR STORYBOOK LAND

No alcoholic beverages are allowed to be consumed or sold during the summer season (Memorial day through Labor Day) at those areas of Wylie Park known as Storybook Land, the Land of Oz, and the zoo (collectively referred to as "Storybook Land"). But outside the summer season, a group activity or public event at those areas for the sole benefit of Storybook Land or the PRF may be permitted by the Board or PRF official to serve, or licensed by the Council to sell, and individuals may consume, alcoholic beverages *provided all* funds raised by the activity or event are donated to Storybook Land or the PRF Gift Fund.

I. GLASS CONTAINERS RESTRICTED

Only non-glass containers are allowed in City parks. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited from being served to the public in glass containers except under a Facility Permit where the permitted activity is exclusively indoors.

J. PARKS USED AS PUBLIC SCHOOL PLAYGROUNDS

Frontier Park and Lincoln Recreation Area, in cooperation with Aberdeen School District No. 6-1, are used as elementary school playgrounds during the academic year (mid-August through end of May). No alcoholic beverages will be allowed at those parks at any time during the academic year, but may be allowed as set forth in Appendix 1 or Appendix 2 during the summer break from June 1 to August 15.

K. PRF RULES FOR ANY FACILITY PERMIT

"Last call": All sales and/or service of alcoholic beverages shall conclude one (1) hour prior to the end of the event but no later than one (1) hour prior to park curfew unless extended by the Facility Permit or PRF official. Park curfew is 11:00 p.m.

Buffer zone: Alcoholic beverage selling or serving stations must be located a

minimum of fifty feet (50') from any playground.

Security personnel: If alcoholic beverages are sold or served at a *public event*, the permittee will be required to obtain and pay for approved security personnel and/or Police Department personnel from the beginning of alcohol service to the end of the event. An exception to this requirement may be granted by the Director upon the applicant demonstrating that an adequate alternative system of alcohol security will be provided.

The Board or Director may require approved security personnel at a *private event* where alcoholic beverages will be sold or served.

ARTICLE 4 ADOPTION OF POLICY

In accordance with Aberdeen City Code, Sec. 36-60, a proposal of this Policy was submitted to the Aberdeen City Council on May 4, 2022, for its review and recommendation. The Council duly considered the proposed Policy at its regular meeting on May 16, 2022, and recommended adoption without changes.

With appropriate considerations given to protection of the health, safety, property, and general welfare of the community, the Park and Recreation Board adopted the foregoing Policy in compliance with the provisions of Aberdeen City Code, Sec. 36-60.


This Policy supersedes all contrary provisions regarding alcoholic beverages set forth elsewhere in policies and procedures of the Board and PRF.
